3 4	I'm pleased to have join the Hawaii Dental Association as its next Executive Director, as of March 2017. My thanks to the HDA leadership, programs, membership, and staff –
5	for the warm welcomes, introductions, and onboarding. Special thanks to Dr. Steve
6	Wilhite for serving as Interim Executive Director during this transition.

8	Despite staffing changes, HDA leadership and staff remain committed to providing

19 20	All offices in the HDA Building are rented throughout 2017, although we will welcome a

23	The Hawaii Dental Association Convention 2017 was very successful, well-received, and
24	is a great benefit for our HDA members. We look forward to hosting the ADA in
25	October 2018.

27	The HDA Foundation officially launched in 2017, with the full support of the HDA; we
28 29	are excited to improve the oral health of Hawaii's community with the help of our 501c3 partner. Together, the HDA and its charitable arm, the Hawaii Dental Association
30	Foundation, will lead in Hawaii's oral health efforts through advocacy and systems
31	change, and programming and educational initiatives.

33	Our membership remains strong with 991 members, which is over 90% of all dentists
34	licensed and practicing in Hawaii. We remain one of the very few states within the
35	dental association community with a high member retention rate. With strength in
36	numbers, our advocacy efforts continue to grow and we will continue to rely on our
37	members in upcoming legislative sessions as organized dentistry faces ongoing
38 39	regulations.
