These efforts were to create member involvement opportunities and to offer increased member value.

The annual February Give Kids a Smile (GKAS) event was a huge success, entertaining, educating and treating over 100 kids, and the Foundation organized an additional GKAS event on October 17 at Kuhio Elementary School. The GKAS Hawaii Fundraiser Gala is being held on October 20 at the Sheraton Waikiki. The HDA Foundation will honor several individuals and groups at the Fundraiser Gala. The 2018 expense attributed to the HDAF was \$18,000.
