- 8 COVID-19 pandemic, keeping our members safe and informed when there were no precedents to
- 9 reference or clear paths to follow.

- 11 We were fortunate to have our largest revenue producing event, the HDA Convention, prior to
- 12 COVID-19. Travel restrictions prevented our officers, trustees, and delegates from attending
- 13 their scheduled HDA/ADA in person meetings, caucuses, and the 2020 ADA House of
- 14 Delegates. Although on site interactions were sorely missed, the savings on travel and venue
- 15 expenses were significant. Combined with healthy reserves, this should give us a bit of
- 16 breathing room for the financial uncertainties in 2021.

- 19 organized dentistry more than any other time in recent history. As HDA President, I witnessed
- 20 firsthand how all components of the ADA tripartite worked together, going above and beyond

- strong, united voice to support us in the face of fear mongering and subversive rhetoric from the
- 23 media and other organizations.
