Report of the HDA Dental Education Program – 2021-H 1 2 Strategic Plan Goal #1 - Membership: Recruit and Retain members by offering 3 relevant membership value within an inclusive and engaging environment. 4 5 6 The Dental Education Program provides Hawaii Dental Association members with 7 quality continuing dental education from internationally recognized speakers at a 8 reasonable cost. Additionally, it provides members the opportunity to visit exhibitors, 9 who share the latest in dental products and services, and features a full display of state-of-10 the-art equipment and technology. Program members planned, organized, and run the 11 12 Hawaii Dental Association Convention in January every year – EXCEPT for the years that COVID-19 has disrupted our regularly scheduled programming. 13 14 The word "pandemic" certainly has a long list of factors with various government 15 regulations and a healthcare responsibility to the community to consider when cancelling 16 our convention. The DEP has planned and executed the CE series virtually via Zoom for 17 2021. This year included Ethics with Mr. Art Curley with 477 attendees, HIOSH with 18 19 Mr. Alan Yamamoto with 294 attendees, sleep apnea with Dr. Fernanda Alameida with 172 attendees, social media with Mr. Ali Oromchian with 118 attendees, and practice 20 management with Ms. Cindy Ishimoto with 84 attendees. There is a positive net gain 21 income from the virtual classes but it is very limited (estimated to be around \$22,000 for 22 three classes). Attendance income is hard to predict, and without the usual income from 23 exhibitors. DEP income is difficult to estimate. 24 25 26 Next year for 2022, we are planning for two virtual and two in-person classes – as the state permits given current circumstances. Thursday, January 27th, 2022 will be the one-27 28 day in-person CE event with three speakers and a few exhibitors, at the Hawaii Convention Center (crossing fingers on this, as currently all gatherings are cancelled for 29 the next month). Plan B will be to convert to virtual classes. And while you are reading 30 this, the plan may have already changed – such as is a sign of the times. 31 32 33 In June 2021, we submitted our renewal to ADA CERP and will be notified of ADA's 34 decision sometime in October. 35 36 Dental Education Program members are Drs.
