9	Informing the membership of the value of strong and consistent legislative representation
10	by the Hawaii Dental Association is paramount to sustaining effective policy outcomes.
11	Legislation involving dentistry affects all members, general or specialists.
12	
13	Promoting oral health, enhancing policymaker awareness, and improving the salience of
14	oral health issues will ensure the Hawaii Dental Association is recognized as the experts
15 16	in dentistry and in improving the oral health of the people of Hawaii.
10	Ensuring that the profession of dentistry is protected and maintained at the highest regard,

21	Activities:
22	Year 2020-2021 presented unique challenges due to the COVID-19 meeting restrictions
23	with legislators, yet HDA effectively met with policy leaders including legislators,
24	committee chairs, legislative leaders, and allied organization leaders virtually and when
25	appropriate in person. On the national level, on "January 13, 2021, legislation was
26	enacted that partially repeals the McCarran-Ferguson Act of 1945, a longstanding
27	antitrust exemption for the "business of health insurance," including the business of
28	dental insurance, as part of the Competitive Health Insurance Reform Act of 2020." The
29	HDA Legislative Program actively worked on this issue for many years.
30	
31	The Hawaii Public Policy Advocates, LLC dedicated work served as our lobbying voice
32	on all legislative fronts, coordinating lobbying meetings, preparing and presenting
33 34	testimony, helping research and draft legislation and responses to legislator requests, and promoting HDA as the state's preeminent voice on oral health. It launched a new
54 35	technology advocacy tool called Voter Voice for HDA members to engage in advocacy
36	using mobile devices and it continued to be HDA's rapid-response team for identifying
37	legislative and policymaking opportunities and threats.
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39	Key state issues of focus include telehealth, licensure, remote continuing education,
40	regulation of dentistry, dental hygiene, proposals to add mid-level providers, and regulate
41	dental assistants, all of which require monitoring and robust advocacy efforts.
