Report of the Dental Education Program – 2019

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2 3 Strategic Plan Goal 1 – Membership: Recruit and Retain members by offering relevant 4 membership value within an inclusive and engaging environment. 5 6 The Dental Education Program provides Hawaii Dental Association members with quality 7 continuing dental education from internationally recognized speakers at a reasonable cost. 8 Additionally, it provides members the opportunity to visit exhibitors, who share the latest in dental products and services, and feature a full display of state-of-the-art equipment and 9 technology. Program Chair Dr. Jaclyn Lum and program members plan, organize, and run The 10 11 Hawaii Dental Association Convention (HDAC) in January every year. 12 In 2019, a smaller CE Program was held on April 11th and 12th due to contractual agreements 13 14 with ADA which held their annual convention in October 2018 in Honolulu. This shortened 15 version offered five speakers including an ethics course that was repeated and a 60-table 16 exhibitor hall. 17 18 Attendees totaled 973, of which 483 are HDA member dentists (99 of those 483 were HDA life 19 members). The remaining 411 were HDA member staff and dental team who came to support 20 our heavily-loaded doctor course schedule. The repeated Ethics course given by Dr. Siang Tan 21 drew in a total of 428 dentists and hygienists (310 of those were HDA members that attended for 22 free as a member benefit). The Life member lunch enjoyed a good turn out for a short year at 54 23 members. Henry Schein also pitched in to sponsor the Thursday "Snack Break" in the small 24 exhibit hall during class breaks, with popcorn and mochi ice cream! 25 26 This year we also worked with a new local event management company, Events International 27 with Honolulu Box Office, who helped not only with a new registration site but also served as 28 event managers for our convention. There were a number of hiccups with the registration site 29 that could not be fixed in real time this year. However, they have planned a new registration 30 system and are enthusiastic to improve on the areas needed, and immediately worked to address 31 attendees' needs. 32 33 Income from this CE Program was lower than our rough estimate; the infrequency of this 34 Program makes it difficult to guesstimate numbers. However, income is to be considered additional to the received \$273,986.13 from ADA as reimbursement for the 2018 and 2019 HDA 35 conventions' profit loss due to the ADA annual session in October of 2018. Overall expenses 36 37 remained similar on fixed areas with the Hawaii Convention Center regardless of the turnout. HDA CE Program brought in \$138,390.00 and expended \$114,942.65 making our net income at 38 39 \$23,447.35. 40 Planning for 2020 is currently in the works. HDAC 2020 will be back to our regular annual 41 convention schedule on January 23rd and 24th, 2020, featuring ten speakers scouted by our 42 Program members. Exhibitor booth sales are currently open and attendee registration is expected 43 44 to open in the fall of 2019. 45
