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6 The Hawaii Dental Association Young Dentist Group (YDG) has continued its mission to

7 provide continuing education, social networking, and community outreach opportunities for its

- 8 young dentist members.
- 9 10 Continuing Education
- 11 The YDG held three sponsored continuing education meetings thus far, with lectures from Drs.
- 12 Wade Takenishi, Wynn Okuda, and Stacie Sueda. The next CE meeting is scheduled for
- 13 October 24th. Steady attendance of approximately 40 incoming young dentists and residents has
- been noted. One observation is a decrease in the number of attendees in the 5-10yr out-of-school
- range. Although this is likely a reflection of the evolving work/life schedule of dentists in this
- age group, we will need to target strategies to increase perceived value and convenience and
- 17 therefore, participation. This same age range, however, has shown more activity in advocacy
- 18 movements despite decreased CE attendance.

- 20 <u>Social Networking</u>
- 21 Following the HDA Convention, our annual convention mixer was held at Dave & Busters,
- 22 which is typically well-attended by our neighbor island members. This past August, in keeping
- 23 with the HDA's strategic plan to increase membership, a successful new dentist welcome and
- recruitment social was hosted at Harry's Hardware. It was a full house with attendees lingering
- 25 long after closing. Data from HDA staff would be helpful to track how many new members
- 26 were gained following this event. The next highly anticipated social will be the Give Kids a
- 27 Smile Fundraiser After-Party at Alohilani's O-bar.
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- 29 <u>Community Outreach</u>
- 30 Every February, the Young Dentist Program powers the Hawaii Dental Association Foundation's
- Give Kids a Smile outreach program. This year, thirteen dentists volunteered their time to
- 32 conduct interactive oral hygiene presentations at seven schools with Mr. Scott Kurosawa from
- 33 Central Pacific Bank and Patterson supply representatives present at each school event to help
- 34 distribute goodie bags.
- 35
- On Saturday, February 23rd, about 100 volunteers 34 dentists, 9 hygienists, 20 staff members,
- and 10 dental assisting students from KCC among others came out to support this annual
- community event. Over 90 children received oral hygiene and nutrition counseling education.
- 39 Data gleaned from the event include: of which, 75 children were treated with prophy and
- 40 fluoride that day; and 31% were identified as needing further dental treatment or urgent dental
- care. Data from outreach and promotional efforts showed that 41% of the families heard of our
 event directly through the schools, and 19% were word-of-mouth referrals.
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- Each year, the program runs more smoothly, and we are happy to see repeat attendees in children
- 45 whose families show great appreciation for our presence in their community. We owe a debt of
- 46 gratitude to Hawaii Public Policy Advocates for their support in obtaining media presence every

47 48 40	year and in helping the Maui Give Kids a Smile event increase its public awareness as well. Strategies to consider for 2020 include bolstering program attendance on Oahu, offering sealants,
49 50	and extending participation to Kauai or the Big Island.

52	Dr. Jaclyn Palola attended the ADA FDI convention in San Francisco in September 2019 as
53	Hawaii's new dentist representative. There, she attended the New Dentist Conference and
54	reception, sat in on the introduction to the ADA House of Delegates, and attended receptions
55	alongside the Hawaii ADA delegates. In addition, her classes focused on the following topics:
56	CAD/CAM dentistry, global marketing, statistics on the future of dentistry, and a live patient
57	case on maxillary implant placement and hybrid denture provisionalization. Dr. Palola and the
58	YDG are thankful to the board for its inclusivity and prioritization in providing this opportunity
59	to a young dentist each year.
